Their children and grandchildren meant everything to them. RIP Uncle Al. Love Roseann and Dr Claudio Guillermo

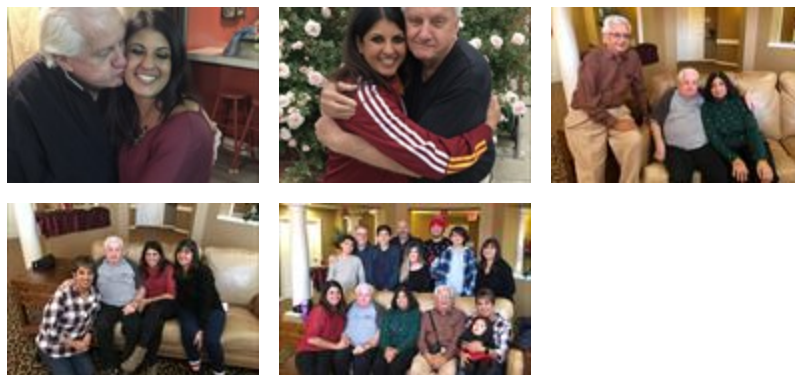
