Barbara Anne Warriner, 63, passed from this life on Sunday, June 5, 2011, at home in Aledo, Texas.

Royalton, Ohio and held a realtor's license. Her greatest profession was that of a dedicated and loving wife, mother, grandmother, aunt, mother/sister in law, and friend.

Barbara married Richard Warriner on June 24, 1967. Together they raised three children. They moved to Aledo in 1998 and were among the early members of Holy Redeemer Catholic Church. Barbara enjoyed sewing and crocheting, made Baptismal Garments for those babies being welcomed into the church, and sang beautifully in the choir. She also made heart pillows providing comfort to breast cancer survivors.
