It was 1970, the Vietnam war was raging, students were revolting, campuses were burning...and we had to wear neck ties and sit in alphabetical order. Go figure. Ray was 'Kuhel; I was Kvaska. Alphabetical... Destiny. We sat next to each other for four tough years, bartended together, attended every home Buckeye game together, joined the Navy together, went to the Philippines together and served together 3 more times at Jacksonville, Norfolk and Bethesda. After his retirement and later mine, we continued on golf and fishing trips, and regardless of where we were in the world, watched every Buckeye game together, either in person or via text/phone throughout the game. Ray lived larger than life and had multiple 'tribes'- his hunting group, his fishing group, his Navy group, his gym group and his Virginia Beach neighborhood group. Between us all, we could fill volumes of Ray stories and I look forward to a Celebration of Life event when it makes sense.
