Dorothy Geddes (nee Duthie), a beloved wife, mother, and grandmother passed away at the age of 89 on March 1, 2025. Born on August 20, 1935, in Aberdeen, Scotland, Dorothy embodied warmth, love, and resilience, and touched the lives of all who were fortunate enough to know her.

Dorothy's journey to the United States was driven by her desire for a better life for her family. She immigrated with her husband, Roger, bringing with her not just hope but also their son in 1962. Together, they went on to raise two more children, Sandra and Glenn. In 1972, the family made their home in Eastlake, where Dorothy dedicated her life to nurturing her children and contributing to the community through volunteering and supporting various local organizations. She volunteered with her close friend Jo Welly at the Christ Child Society of Cleveland, a Catholic non-denominational charity where she performed preschool eye screening for glasses, made fundraiser raffle baskets, and worked at the Cottage Thrift store where she coordinated shopping trips for women and children in need.

Her unwavering love and dedication were particularly evident in her care for her son Glenn, who faced developmental challenges. Dorothy's nurturing spirit extended beyond her family; she was a devoted grandmother to Ian, Morgan, and Riley Bloom, as well as a cherished sister, aunt, and friend. Her joy and laughter will remain a cherished memory for all who had the privilege of

sharing in her life.

Dorothy is survived by her loving husband, Roger A. Geddes; her children, Roger Geddes, Sandra Bloom (Geddes), and Glenn Geddes; her adored grandchildren, Ian, Morgan, and Riley Bloom; and many nieces and nephews, all of whom will continue to carry her light in their hearts. She was preceded in death by her beloved three brothers and three sisters, who welcomed her with open arms.
