Dr. Julian M. Loube, M.D., 66, died unexpectedly at his home in Concord Twp. Monday April 2, 2012.

He was born in Washington, D.C. on Sept. 5, 1945 the son of Dr. Samuel and Evelyn Egber Loube.

"This was my Julian"...Try to imagine being only 16 years old walking into your first day at Syracuse University, then continuing to medical school at George Washington University... and graduating top ten in his class. After graduating, he became a Flight Surgeon in the United States Air Force during the VietNam Conflict.

He was a Family Physician and E.R. doctor. For the last twenty years of his career, he started his own medical legal consulting group, Loube Consulting LLC, now in Mentor. He was passionate about his work as a doctor and he took his oath very seriously; he always put his patients first. His success as a consultant earned him appearances on Larry King Live and 60 Minutes with Mike Wallace. As a consultant, his expertise was called on by The Department of Justice.

Outside of work he was active with his family, his church and his community. He coached soccer, he was a swim team judge and one year even decided to teach 8th grade science. In Concord Twp. he was an integral part of the Concord Recycling Committee and helped get that program started. He loved going to church at Mentor United Methodist; and charity work in his community. He really enjoyed photography, trains and collecting antiques. But the times he enjoyed most in life was when he was hand-in-hand with his wife, Brenda.

He is survived by his loving wife Brenda J. Waychoff-Richardson; his children: Scott Xiaoyun Loube, Steven Nina Loube, Jenny Andrew Loube, Terri Wes Burgner, Erin Brandon Loube, Angel Lysander Richardson, Marcus Richardson, Chrissy, Baby, Jay, Cliff and Andrea; his siblings: John Peiyi Light, Susan Tracy Loube, Patricia Chris Cheetham, Pam Loube, and Brian Yibin Loube; his granddaughter Zoe Burgner; and his dogs: Rocco and Isabella.

Julian would always say, "Look, I've been blessed with "Cheaper By The Dozen"." He really loved being a Dad.

He was preceded in death by his parents; his sister Karen Loube and his grandson Zane Burgner.
