In addition to her parents, Betty is preceded in death by beloved husband, Anton William Buza in 1982 and beloved son, Wayne Anton Buza in 2015.

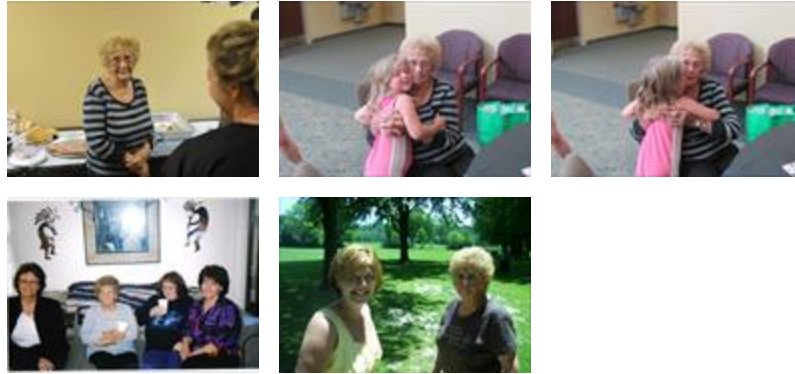
Due to Covid-19 a private family prayer service will be held at the Monreal Srnick Funeral Home, 35400 Curtis Blvd. Eastlake.
