Howard F. Briggs, beloved husband, son, father, grandfather, great grandfather, brother, uncle, and friend, passed away peacefully at home surrounded by his family on February 11, 2023, at the age of 66.

Howie graduated from St. Joseph High School in 1974. He then went on and dedicated over 40 years as a Glazier and was a proud member of Local 181 Glaziers. He was the Co-Commissioner of the NorthEast Ohio Baseball League and Assistant Area Director of NE Ohio Five Tool Youth Baseball, in addition to his roles as Commissioner of Fall Baseball.net and Tournament Director for Batter-Up events. Howie had a passion for volunteering and was a board member for the Littlest Heroes-Pediatric Cancer Foundation and was recently honored as its 2022 Man of the Year. Howie and Andrea spent many years traveling the world together and were always looking forward to their next adventure. He was an avid bowler and was very proud of his perfect game of 300. Above all, Howie cherished time spent with his loved ones and made memories that will last a lifetime. He was a kind and devoted family man who touched the lives of everyone he met.

As The Littlest Heroes was beginning to grow, we saw an opportunity to launch a baseball tournament – one that would provide a great outlet for participation and generate revenue so that we could expand our services.

Once again, Howie stepped up to the plate.

In 2008, Howie launched The Littlest Heroes Baseball Tournament as his wife Andrea was finishing her battle with cancer. He saw his giftings and experience intersect with a whole new way to give back. His already immense impact on America’s pastime grew even more.

Over the 14 years of the tournament’s existence, more than \$300,000 has been raised for The Littlest Heroes – generating resources to help children and their families in need.

Howie's service is not simply tied to the tournament. The same year he launched the tournament, he went "all in" to serve this organization. Howie joined the board in 2008, and he now serves as its Chairman.

As the Board Chairman, Howie rolls up his sleeves, from connecting with kids on the baseball field to serving families in their homes. Without Howie, it is difficult to imagine the Adopt-A-Family program seeing its current level of success. He personally drives from Toledo to Pittsburgh and everywhere in between so that he can deliver gifts to hundreds of families of our Littlest Heroes, impacting over 400 individuals each year. He rolls up his sleeves, connects with those we serve, and makes an impact on whole families.

The Littlest Heroes has impacted thousands of children and their families, and we are so proud of the organization that we have built. As believers in people, we have seen this play out in the leadership and service of Howie Briggs.

Because Howie stepped up to the plate, The Littlest Heroes is thriving because of his leadership, service, and personal commitment, and we are proud to honor him today.

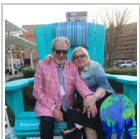
