



## Reverend Jerome John Duke

August 9, 1942 - January 21, 2024

Reverend Jerome J. Duke, age 81, peacefully passed away on January 21, 2024 at Mount St. Joseph. Rev. Jerry was born on August 9, 1942 in Cleveland, OH to John and Katherine Duke, (both deceased).

Rev. Jerry attended Borromeo Seminary for 4 years and St. Mary's Seminary for 3 years prior to his ordination 60 years ago. Rev. Jerry is now at his assigned post at Spirit Ranch, his cabin. He enjoyed spending his pasttime praying on his mountain where Spirit Ranch is located. He was a priest at Christ the King Church in East Cleveland for many years. For over 30 years, he was pastor at St. Cyril & Methodius Church in Lakewood. He then went to Our Lady of Angels in Rocky River before retiring. Rev. Jerry was known to be a straight shooter. He retired to enjoy time at his cabin, and with family and friends. He will be greatly missed. He'll always be remembered by saying Grace, "Rubba dub dub, thanks for the grub, Yay God, Let's eat".

Rev. Jerry is survived by siblings, Carol Swartzwelder, Larry Duke, Betty Petranek, Andrew Duke, and Ronald (Cindy) Duke. “*Fr. Duke was truly a Cleveland legend and a community pillar at SS. Cyril and Methodius. His stirring and relatable homilies, which he delivered with his characteristic booming voice and good (sometimes self-deprecating) humor, attracted crowds of Catholics from all over Lakewood (especially Birdtown and the East End) as well as Cleveland's West Side. In fact, when Fr. Duke was doing Mass, you knew it was going to be well-attended (even the early Sunday morning Masses). His homilies were not only relatable to his parishioners, but also socially relevant, attacking selfishness, greed, war, injustice, and consumerism in society (his biting criticism on the culture of "what's in it for me?" especially comes to mind). I especially fondly remember one of his great Christmas eve homilies, where he read Leo Tolstoy's short story "Where Love Is, God Is" (on Christmas eve, he would often read such homilies from a rocking chair).*

*Overall, the man truly lived Christ's mission, as well as the Christian faith and community service more generally, with his thick white beard, trademark Stetson hat and cowboy boots, love for Slovak-style stuffed cabbage, and penchant for baking multitudes of apple pies. He embodied everything that characterized the best of Cleveland and Birdtown: tough, ethnic, and "tell-it-like-it-is" working class (sometimes he liked to liken himself to Yosemite Sam). He will be greatly missed by many Clevelanders, but his legacy will forever live on in all the people who he touched.*

*RIP Fr. Duke and, to quote another Cleveland legend, Bob Hope, "thanks for the memories."*
