Mr. Huber was a former volleyball coach for Lake Catholic High School and the Junior Olympics. He loved spending time with his family, especially his nieces and nephews. He graduated from Lake Catholic High School in 1989 and he received his bachelor's degree from John Carroll University in 1993.

Keith was a Senior Executive Customer Representative for Merck Global Human Health for the past 15 years.
