Louis Lerer, 61, died unexpectedly Saturday, Dec. 3, 2011.

He was born May 17, 1950, to Abram and Anna Klopot Lerer, both of whom were Holocaust survivors.

Louis was a veteran of the U.S. Army, serving during the Vietnam War. On May 4, 1980, he married Linda M. Salerno, his wife of 31 years.

He is survived by his wife, Linda; sons, Jason and Matthew; daughter, Kaitlyn; mother, Anna; sister, Lee; and brother, Harry.

He was preceded in death by his father; and his brother, Morry.

Funeral services will be 10 a.m. Friday, Dec. 9, 2011, at Monreal Funeral Home, 35400 Curtis Blvd., Eastlake, where visitation will be held from 3 to 8 p.m. Thursday. Burial will be at Mentor Cemetery.
