Sally made a difference in countless lives, and I feel grateful to have known her and worked beside her. Her legacy lives on not only in her family, who loved her deeply, but in the many individuals she helped guide toward a better path. She leaves behind a lasting imprint on our community and on my heart.

I will miss her dearly, and I will always remember her with admiration, gratitude, and love.
