Many a Sunday did she pack her 3 children in the car, pick up her mother and start out for the day looking for a "good" fried chicken place to eat it, and she loved fried chicken from her farm days in Kansas. She was a spectacular cook and has taught us all how to make wonderful meals and different types of food. Also, Sara had an extensive cookbook collection that she read all the time always looking for a challenge to create. In 1970, with the help of family, she opened Fontaine Bleau Party Center in Avon Lake and there embarked a 26 year career in cooking and catering. During that time, Sara and her husband were also part of the founding members of the North Olmsted Hockey Club that their sons played for. Sara continued to be a part of the "Mother's Hockey Group" that still meets frequently for lunches to catch up on everyone's family and to stay in touch.
